FOREIGN LANGUAGE TEACHERS

Salary Range: \$ 36,430- \$125,175 per year

Duty Locations: Throughout the U.S. and abroad

Summary: The Defense Language Institute Foreign Language Center (DLIFLC) offers foreign language instruction in various languages to approximately 3,500 students on a year-round schedule. Courses are intensive, and the classes are limited to 10 students who attend classes six to seven hours a day. Faculty members teach all aspects of resident and non-resident courses to military personnel and federal government civilian employees, using real-world proficiency activities. In addition to teaching listening, reading, writing and speaking skills, the curriculum includes instruction in geopolitical, economic and social attributes of foreign cultures, as well as job-related tasks.

Major Duties: A typical eight-hour day (40-hour work week) consists of four or more hours of classroom instruction in addition to preparing for instruction, adapting teaching material, administering and grading tests, checking homework, evaluating student performance, student counseling and other related activities. Faculty members are expected to stay abreast of current teaching, testing, and curriculum development theories and methods and participate in Institute sponsored professional development.

EDUCATION SPECIALIST, NATIONAL PARK SERVICE

Salary Range: \$57,408 - \$74,628 per year

Duty Locations: Vicksburg, MS

Summary: Experience your America and build a fulfilling career by joining the National Park Service. Become a part of our mission to unite our past, our cultures and our special places, to establish important connections to the present and build a rich and lasting legacy for future generations.

Major Duties: You will develop and implement a formal, structured curriculum-based education program curriculum-based learning at the elementary through post secondary levels and develop methods and protocols to measure the effectiveness of education programs. You will conduct programs and teacher training workshops in a variety of sites, including the park, classrooms, through partnership with statewide and regional educational service cooperatives, and via distance learning technology.

FEDERAL EMPLOYERS CAN HELP YOU REPAY YOUR STUDENT LOANS

- ★ Agencies are authorized to help repay up to \$10,000 of a loan per year, up to \$60,000 total per employee.
- ★ An employee who receives student loan repayments must commit to remaining in the service of the federal government for at least three years.
- ★ In 2008, **35 federal agencies** provided **6,879 employees** with almost **\$51 million** in student loan repayment.

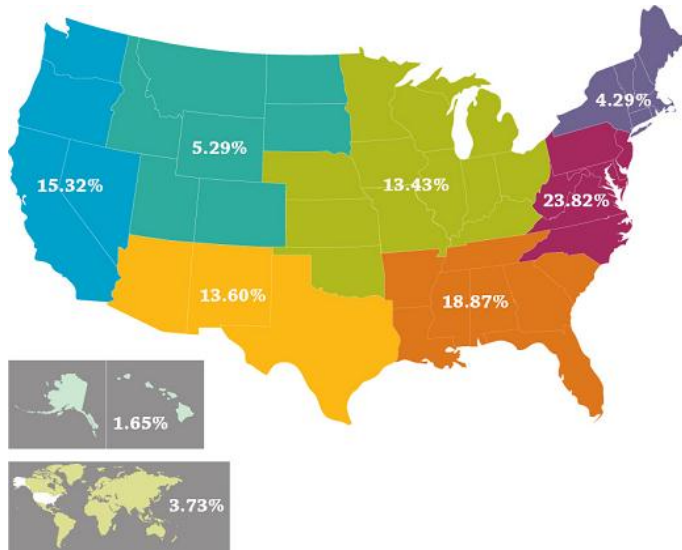
