The **Department of the Interior** protects America's natural resources and heritage, honors our cultures and tribal communities, and supplies the energy to power our future. Within DOI, the Bureau of Land Management seeks to sustain the health, productivity, and diversity of America's public lands for the use and enjoyment of present and future generations. It administers over 245 million acres of public land, more than any other federal agency. About 10,000 full-time employees work to manage public land for a variety of uses, such as energy development, livestock grazing, recreation, and timber harvesting, while simultaneously protecting a wide array of natural, cultural, and historical resources.

DUTIES

As a **Natural Resources Specialist** at the Bureau of Land Management, you will:

- Serve as the technical specialist in the use of the Geographic Information System (GIS) to support resource management planning efforts
- Provide professional resource management information analysis and make recommendations to interdisciplinary planning teams
- Train resource personnel on GIS and other software systems and on natural resource management data policies, practices, and procedures

REQUIREMENTS

- U.S. citizenship
- A Bachelor's Degree in the biological sciences, agriculture, natural resources management, chemistry, or a related discipline *or* a combination of education and experience
