DUTIES

As a **police officer** with the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency, you will:

- Provide investigative and dignitary protection, emergency response, and physical security
- Prepare accident, incident, and security violation reports; conduct interviews and briefings; and provide customer support services

REQUIREMENTS

- U.S. citizenship
- At least 2 years of education beyond the high school level with at least 12 semester/18 quarter hours in Criminology, General Law, Law Enforcement, Police Administration, Police Investigation, Police Law and Evidence, or similar subjects
- Successful completion of an NGA-approved Law Enforcement Academy within 2 years
- Ability to pass a polygraph test and obtain Top Secret security clearance
