DUTIES

As an **Electronics Technician** for the Federal Aviation Administration, you will:

- Install and maintain electronic equipment and lighting aids required for aviation navigation to assure a reliable, safe, and smooth flow of air traffic.
- Work with radar, communications, computers, navigational aids, airport lighting aids, and electrical/mechanical support for facilities on and off airports.
- Work on periodic and corrective maintenance, troubleshooting, and repair and replacement of malfunctioning equipment.
- Assist in the design, development and evaluation of new types of electronic equipment.

REQUIREMENTS

- U.S. citizenship
- Three years of specialized experience *or* a Bachelor's Degree with major study (or at least 24 semester hours of courses) in computer science, mathematics, electronics, physical sciences, information management, engineering, or telecommunications
