Physical Therapist

In your position as a Physical Therapist you will:

- Interview patients and evaluate their present disability.
- Plan treatment based on information of the patient's physical and mental conditions, cooperation and various psychological factors.
- Utilize isokinetic equipment for testing and interpreting the strength, power and endurance of muscles to assist in the diagnosis and treatment of musculoskeletal conditions.
- Implement treatment individually as well as in groups.
- Use periodic evaluations to determine if treatment goals are being achieved.

Requirements:

- Must have a bachelor's degree supplemented by a physical therapy curriculum.
- Must have a Physical Therapist License in U.S. state/territory.
- Must be a United States citizen.
- Education may be substituted by specialized experience.
